Conflict of Interest/Nepotism

Purchases of supplies, equipment, or services from suppliers or companies in which school directors have a substantial* rather than a remote interest** must meet open competitive bidding requirements and be affirmed by a two-thirds vote of the entire board. Purchases from public utilities and other regulated suppliers are excepted.

No person who is a spouse to any school director shall be employed full time by such board.

- 1. A non salaried officer of a nonprofit corporation.
- 2. A landlord or tenant of the contracting party.
- 3. An attorney of a contracting party.
- 4. A member of a nonprofit cooperative marketing association.
- 5. An owner of less than three percent of the shares of a corporation for profit, provided the total annual income from dividends, including the value of stock dividend, from the corporation does not exceed five percent of the total annual income.
- 6. An officer being reimbursed for his or her actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of official duty.
- 7. A recipient of public services generally provided by the incorporated city or town, political sub-division or state department, commission, agency, body, or board of which he/she is an officer or employee, on the same terms and conditions as if he/she were not an officer or employee.
