Mission Statement

The mission of the Madison Junior Senior High School community is to inspire academic and personal excellence in a safe learning environment where all students can develop the skills necessary to lead purposeful lives as responsible citizens and lifelong learners.

The School and Its Community

Madison Junior Senior High School is a public seventh through twelfth comprehensive school of approximately 250 students with a teaching staff of twenty-nine. Madison is a small, rural community on the Kennebec River. It is approximately 45 miles north of the state capitol, Augusta, and 40 miles southeast of Sugarloaf Mountain, USA. It has a population of approximately 5000. The recent opening of Timber HP in downtown Madison has revitalized the community and brought a new sustainable product to North America. It has also employed many community members as well as provided encouraging opportunities for our school district. Sappi Fine Paper is located 15 miles away. Madison is also home to “Backyard Farms” a 42 acre of year-round greenhouse growing space providing vine-ripened tomatoes delivered daily throughout the Northeast. Backyard Farms has plans for further development and employs approximately 200 people.

Graduation Requirements

Class Rank

Beginning in the Spring of 2006, Madison Area Memorial High School began weighting honors classes at 1.03; advanced placement and articulated classes through Thomas College and Kennebec Valley Community College at 1.05. A weighted GPA and class rank are computed at the end of each semester which includes all grades in all courses, except those classes that are pass/fail.

Class of 2023 Statistics

The Class of 2023 graduated 45 students. 37.5% will continue their education in four-year programs; 26% entered a two-year or community college program; and 31% entered the workforce.

Honors, Advanced Placement, Online

Honors classes are offered in all major subject areas—**English, mathematics, science and history**. These are offered as individual contracts with teachers.

Advanced Placement courses are for students who demonstrate high achievement in a particular subject area. These advanced placement classes include U.S. Government, and Computer Science, depending on student enrollment. AP4Me offers English Literature, Psychology, and Biology.

Dual Enrollment classes are offered in English, Mathematics, Accounting and Computer Applications.

Online Classes.

Madison Area Memorial High School offers opportunity for both online and advanced placement classes through AP4Me and college classes through University of Maine System, and KVCC.
